Letter from the Director

Dear Friends,

Thank you for making 2016 the year of strengthening and building collaborations, solidifying our mission to address the impact of aging on families in our community by providing comprehensive, supportive services in a compassionate, safe and engaging setting.

With your help, we hosted a number of community education programs such as "To Whom I May Concern," a presentation designed to share the experience of living with dementia. We welcomed experts from Columbia University to facilitate an educational group focusing on frontotemporal dementia (FTD), providing caregivers and those afflicted with FTD with information and support.

Our "Caregiver Circle" education series focused on safety by hosting professionals from the Greenwich Police Department, Family and Children's Agency and Nathaniel Witherall to address issues such as home safety, personal safety and financial victimization.

In partnership with the Greenwich Junior League, River House clients and families enjoyed a Casino Day filled with games, entertainment and refreshments. Our Therapeutic Recreation Program launched a new initiative in partnership with the New Canaan Mounted Troop in which clients of our program were provided hands-on experiences in horsemanship and equine skills. We developed and launched the "River House Creative Community", designating River House as the prime spot for local artists and performers to share their talents and skills with our clients while also helping us to create awareness of our services. In collaboration with the Greenwich Commission on Aging and Access Independence, River House took on the lead role in hosting the Loan Closet, a free service that lends medical equipment to those in need.

Along with all of these community-based initiatives and events, our professional and committed staff continued to provide comprehensive adult day services in the most caring, client centered, nurturing and compassionate environment. With your help, we raised even more awareness of our programs, resulting in a significantly increased number of clients. We are extremely grateful to all of our partners, friends and supporters for helping River House Adult Day Center reach our goal of

improving the quality of life for aging adults and their caregivers. We will continue to provide the very best care to our community and look forward to celebrating our 40th anniversary with you in the coming year.

Our Health Program relies on professional staff who provide health monitoring and administration of physician prescribed medications and treatments, coordinated care with personal physicians, personal hygiene and bathing, daily therapeutic exercises, nutritious noontime meals and snacks, individual assessments and care plans, toileting, podiatry services and more.

Our Social Services Program

Our Social Services Program provides caregivers individual, family and group counseling, information and referral services, assistance with obtaining financial aid, entitlements and other support as needed. Caregivers and family clients participate in "Care Plan" meetings that closely evaluate an individual's progress, seeking methods to manage identified challenges and establish goals and strategies for caregivers to maintain a quality of life.

Caregiver Information Center

Our Caregiver Information Center was founded in 2010 as a resource to the community. The center is managed by our Director of Social Services and offers information and referral services, individual, family and group counseling, education and support to caregivers as they develop a clear, educated and meaningful plan for themselves and their loved ones.

MasterMind

Our MasterMind Program is an 8-week mind enhancement course taught by our Director of Therapeutic Recreation. This two-tier course engages clients and community participants in challenging and fun activities to enhance memory, verbal fluency, flexible thinking, attention and communication.



Caregiver Circle

Our Caregiver Circle is a four-part education series held twice yearly to provide caregivers information and education on issues related to caring for aging adults. The Caregiver Circle, a collaborative and community based initiative, was founded in 2009 by River House, the Junior League of Greenwich, the Greenwich Commission on Aging and the Greenwich Chapter of the American Red Cross.



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



