Dear Friends,

With your support and commitment to our aging community, River House Adult Day Center reached our 40-year milestone and helped set the pace for the years to come! We began in 1977 as a small program located at the Nathaniel Witherell. In 2008 we moved to our own building, formerly known as the Pump House, and became River House Adult Day Center. For 40 years, we have committed ourselves to addressing the impact of aging on families in our community by providing comprehensive, supportive services in a compassionate, safe and engaging setting.

During our 2017 celebration year, we continued to grow by nurturing new and existing partnerships. We developed a partnership with Norwalk Community College and welcomed more than 50 Home Health Aide students, Nursing (RN) students, a Marketing Intern and a Physical Therapy Intern who had an opportunity to experience the care and support provided at a medical model adult daycare center. We began a collaboration with the University of Connecticut and welcomed a Social Work Student Intern, a Gerontology Student Intern and created the "Baseball Reminiscence Program," which is soon to be featured in a documentary on ESPN. We created a partnership with the Hebrew Wizards' "Better Together" program, matching young students with our aging adults. We worked with the Greenwich Commission on Aging to train staff to become Dementia Friends and are preparing to take a lead role in creating a Dementia and Age Friendly community. We hosted and celebrated our 23rd Annual Garden Party at the Riverside Yacht Club, chaired by Sandy Motland and supported by our Board of Directors, staff and devoted committee. We increased awareness through radio interviews, presentations at the Retired Men's Association of Greenwich, the Senior Men's Association of Stamford, the Junior League of Greenwich, the Inspiration Women's Group, the Annual Alzheimer's Association Dementia Conference, the Women's Club of Greenwich and the Greenwich United Way's Community Planning Council.

2017 marked our first 40 years and we are continuing to pave the way for our future. We are thankful to our Board of Directors, staff, financial supporters, partner organizations, volunteers and to you for placing your trust in River House. The process of moving forward never stops and we remain committed to meeting the ever-changing needs of our aging community. River House Adult Day Center is here for you when your family needs our family. Here's to the next 40 years!

The professional health staff provides consistent person-centered health monitoring and administration of physician prescribed medications and treatments. In addition, personal hygiene and bathing, daily therapeutic exercises, nutritious meals, toileting and podiatry services are a few of our extensive health program services.

The Therapeutic Recreation Program provides individualized and group based programs that address the varying needs of our clients. Simply put, it is FUN for everyone! A team of professional recreation specialists provide stimulating and fun filled days that include socialization and friendship, mentally stimulating activities, visits to local cultural and civic organizations, music therapy, animal and horticultural therapy, all in a dynamic and supportive environment.

The MasterMind Program is an 8-week two-tiered mind enhancement course that engages participants in challenging and fun activities to enhance memory, verbal fluency, flexible thinking, attention and communication. This is especially beneficial to individuals who are experiencing early signs of dementia and Alzheimer's.

Our Waterfall Program is a customized program designed to meet the needs of individuals requiring more attention. The activities emphasize one-on-one attention and care with small groups while using various specialized therapies led by professionally trained and experienced staff.

Caring for the community

More likely than not, you, your neighbor or someone close to you is caring for an aging adult. River House provides a solution for caregivers who wish to have their aging loved ones remain in the comfort of their homes and their communities. River House understands the challenges associated with caring for a loved one and is committed to providing meaningful support and compassion to caregivers. No caregiver should have to attempt the caregiving process alone.

As a direct result of our support for caregivers, River House's caregivers have reported a decrease in absenteeism from their places of employment, have remained engaged in their communities and have increased peace of mind knowing that their loved ones are being cared for during the day.

Caregiver Information Center

Our Caregiver Information Center was founded in 2010 as a resource to the community. The Caregiver Information Center is managed by our Social Services Coordinator and offers information and referral services, individual, family and group counseling, education and support to caregivers. These services help our caregivers develop a clear, educated and meaningful plan for themselves and their loved ones.

Social Services Program

The Social Services program, managed by our Social Services Coordinator, provides caregivers not only counseling and referral services but also helps with obtaining financial aid, entitlements and other support. Caregivers and family members participate in "Care Plan" meetings that closely evaluate an individual's progress, seeking methods to manage any identified challenges and establish goals and strategies for caregivers to improve quality of life.

Caregiver Circle

The Caregiver Circle is an educational series held twice yearly to provide caregivers and community members information and education on issues related to caring for aging adults. The Caregiver Circle, a collaborative and community based initiative, was founded in 2009 by River House, the Junior League of Greenwich, the Greenwich Commission on Aging and the Greenwich Chapter of the American Red Cross.

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

The Witherell Pavilion Club opened its doors at Nathaniel Witherell. The program began as a one-year pilot project spearheaded by a recommendation from the Greenwich Commission on Aging that a communitybased day care center be established to serve the growing elderly population.

The program moved to the Greenwich Senior Center. The Board of Health formed a committee to continue the program, and it was renamed The Greenwich Pavilion Club. The Board of Directors initiated "The Campaign for GADC's Future" to renovate and equip a new facility in Cos Cob.




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2014 GADC changed its name to River House Adult Day Center.

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
