River House's mission is to provide adult day care that works for all families.

Adults who wish to remain in their community but require daytime assistance come to River House up to five days a week to participate in vibrant activities, socialize with their peers, and receive compassionate care. Individuals challenged with dementia, Alzheimer's disease, arthritis, diabetes, stroke, depression, traumatic brain injury, cardiac or pulmonary disease, vision/hearing loss, or other age-related ailments, greatly benefit from River House's team of nurses, health aides, and therapeutic recreation staff who are trained to support their unique needs. River House follows a medical care model where nurses work with every member, their doctors, and their family to provide a personalized plan of care that enhances the member's overall well-being. By providing this crucial daytime care, caregivers are given the respite and peace of mind needed to care for themselves and their loved ones effectively.

River House was founded in 1977 and remains committed to providing the highest quality care to aging adults in Greenwich, Stamford, and the surrounding areas while offering guidance and support to their caregivers. We are proud of our history of service to these communities.









Dear Friends,

It's hard to believe that the pandemic has been upon us for more than 18 months. While some might say that life stopped in March of 2020, at River House, our determination to serve our community at a higher level had only just begun. The pandemic became our opportunity to create a new and improved way to safely do what we are committed to doing— supporting our community. The River House staff, Board and Advisory Board has continued to face the challenges associated with the pandemic with courage, determination, and commitment to our community. Since the start of the pandemic, we have continued to respond with, "Game On, COVID!"

Throughout our brief shift to remote services, we heard our families' pleas to return to the building that so many of us call home. We witnessed the declines in health associated with social isolation and a lack of hands-on nursing care. The stress felt by our family caregivers was palpable. Therefore, in record speed, we created a safely orchestrated return to our onsite program in July 2020. For many months, we juggled onsite programs for those who returned while also accommodating those who remained at home. And then in January of 2021, we were fortunate to receive the vaccine. By the end of February, our entire staff was fully vaccinated and by April of 2021, every River House client was fully vaccinated. We continue to proudly announce that River House is a fully vaccinated adult day care center.

The last year did not pass without challenges, particularly financial challenges. We are forever grateful to you for empowering us with your outpouring of support. Thanks to you, last year's Annual Appeal was the most successful than ever before. We carefully planned a live, in-person event, *Game On!* and many of you came out to show your support. You believed in us, and we cannot thank you enough.

We cannot predict the future but there is one thing that we know for certain. If we continue to march forward with the same courage, determination, and commitment to our community that we have had all along, we will face every challenge and obstacle as our opportunity to rise to the occasion. Game On!

The significance of our past



helps us walk into our future

River House Adult Day Center was founded in 1977 in response to a Greenwich United Way and Commission on Aging study, which suggested the need for a community program for seniors too frail to participate in the Greenwich Senior Center activities. The program, originally called The Witherell Pavilion Club, started in the lower level of the Nathaniel Witherell building. It was so successful, we relocated to our own, dedicated building in 2008. Thanks to the generosity of donors, we were able to raise \$6 million during the Building Capital Campaign from 2005–2008.

The current location is a beautifully renovated 1927 Pump House on the Mianus River, originally supplying water to the Cos Cob Generating Plant next door. The fishway staircase on the side of the building has been retained, and is used to count the yearly migration of Alewife, Blueback Herring, and other species, who ascend the fish ladder once a year, giving conservationists a sense of conditions in the ocean. An average of 5,600 different fish species pass through the Mianus Fishway.

The River House interior is sunny and bright, with views of the river and two floors of wide-open spaces that are flexible enough to accommodate several activities at once yet provide intimate spaces when necessary. The exposed brick and features of the original pump house reminds us of what we loved about our past but are a beautiful example of how we can re-imagine our life for the future.






